

Maritime College of Forest Technology

The Maritime College of Forest Technology (MCFT) specializes in natural resource education. It's located at the Hugh John Flemming Forestry Centre in Fredericton, only three kilometres from the downtown core. Fredericton is a green city, lined with more than 85 km of multi-purpose trails that run through its waterfront, urban and residential areas. Two student residences, Bedard Hall and Torunski Hall, are attached to MCFT's main building.

MCFT's specialized programs include forest technology and advanced fish and wildlife technology. Students have access to three teaching forests: the University of New Brunswick woodlot, the Kingsclear woodlot; and the Acadia Research Forest. In total there are more than 10,000 hectares across the woodlots.

All students participate in regular fieldwork and may visit diverse work sites, from the forest around the college to large industrial operations. MCFT has approximately 100 students; the college's small class sizes and tightly knit community are hallmarks of its educational experience.

For students who wish to continue their education at university, MCFT has articulation agreements with the University of New Brunswick (bachelor of science in forestry), the University of Prince Edward Island (bachelor of wildlife conservation), Cape Breton University (bachelor of engineering technology and bachelor of technology programs) and in British Columbia, at the University of Northern BC (bachelor of science in forestry).

MCFT takes a hands-on approach to education with 50 percent of the time spent doing hands-on learning. The Forest Technology diploma is the specialization of the school, with an additive advanced Fish and Wildlife program that is designed to be taken in conjunction with the Forest Tech program to create a wide range of knowledge and values surrounding natural resource management.
